Another year has flown by and once again the early spring heat and dry has brought on flowering for most of our cultivars here in the Blue Mountains. We will watch our lavender closely to monitor signs of ripeness for harvest and it looks like we will be distilling before and during the Christmas/ New Year period (cue Ode to Joy!).

Keep in mind that TALGA is continually attempting to collect harvest data from our members and we would be delighted if you send us any data that you record especially details of your cultivars and the weight of flowers harvested, what they are used for (dried, oil etc), and if you distill, what your yield is and what method of distillation you are using.

This information is intended to be collated and input into a spreadsheet with more specific statistics on each lavender cultivar and made available to our members. It is a work in progress each year please send your information to Fiona Glover or myself anytime.

TALGA MEMBER FARMS UPDATE

Henle Gardens | Josh Ruff | VIC

Henle Gardens has been ramping up with activity over the past couple of months as we were preparing the property to open our gates for the first time to the public. The past 9 days has been a huge milestone for Henle Gardens as we were selected as one of 23 gardens in the Castlemaine & District Festival of Gardens.

Opening a garden to the public has been a dream of mine and it was amazing to be able to experience people from all over Victoria visit the





garden. We ended up having roughly 700 people visit during the Festival of Gardens and we are forever grateful to our family and friends who have all helped out in making this such a successful experience.

Opening our gardens up to the public provided a valuable opportunity to share our journey and show the various spaces that we have created here. We had many conversations talking about all things gardening but in particular explaining why we chose lavender, how we find lavender grows in the area and what we have done to prepare our soils to get the best growth. We also displayed our still and explained the distilling process. It felt incredibly rewarding to be provided the opportunity to share our knowledge and experiences in this way.

We have a busy month ahead with the flowering, cutting and distilling of our current plants. It will be the first time that we distill at our property so we are excited to give that a go. We have plans in the new year to participate in local markets which will be another new experience and we hope will continue to build our relationships with people in the community. We look forward to an exciting summer and year ahead.

Wine Country Lavender | Karen McRae | NSW

We are certainly having an early harvest this year as our lavender has started flowering a lot earlier than usual. It has been interesting to see how our lavender reacts to changes in the weather – from lots of rain and slow growth, to really warm days (still somewhat wet) and early flowering. I don't think we have been able to really nut down a specific yearly pattern as each year we have experienced drastically different weather.

We have been steam weeding to keep the weeds under control, and have also weeded extensively around the plants (yes by hand!). We have also been mulching along the rows – though this is great to keep on improving our terrible (heavy clay-based) soil, it has brought in a lot of weeds on our fields (so lots of pros and cons there). We are looking to this season's harvest and wish everyone great success – looking forward to seeing everyone's beautiful photos in the new year!

We've just finished a first trim of some new Grosso which was planted back in April this year and they are loving life in QLD.

AGRIFUTURES: POLLINATOR WEEK


Small in size but extraordinarily influential, the European honey bee (Apis mellifera) benefits over one third of Australian agricultural production — while apiarists across the country produce almost 40,000 tonnes of honey per year

This **Australian Pollinator Week**, **from 9 to 17 November** we're celebrating their hard work by showcasing the value that honey bees bring to the agriculture sector as well as the research, development and extension (RD&E) projects that have contributed to this vibrant industry.

Facts about honey bee and pollination in Australia:

- Across Australia, there are almost 2,000 commercial beekeeping enterprises and more than 47,000 recreational beekeepers.
- NSW is home to 31 per cent of the nation's beekeepers and 46 per cent of its hives.
- In the past five years, commercial and recreational beekeepers collectively produced an average of 39,600 tonnes of honey per year.
- The value of crops grown in Australia in 2020-2021 that are at least partially reliant on honey bee pollination was \$12.9 billion.
- The value of honey, beeswax and additional hive products produced by commercial and recreational beekeepers, and income received from paid pollination services in 2023 was \$623.8 million.
